Jo Adams McAuley was born in Waco, Texas. She attended the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville and earned a degree in Political Science.

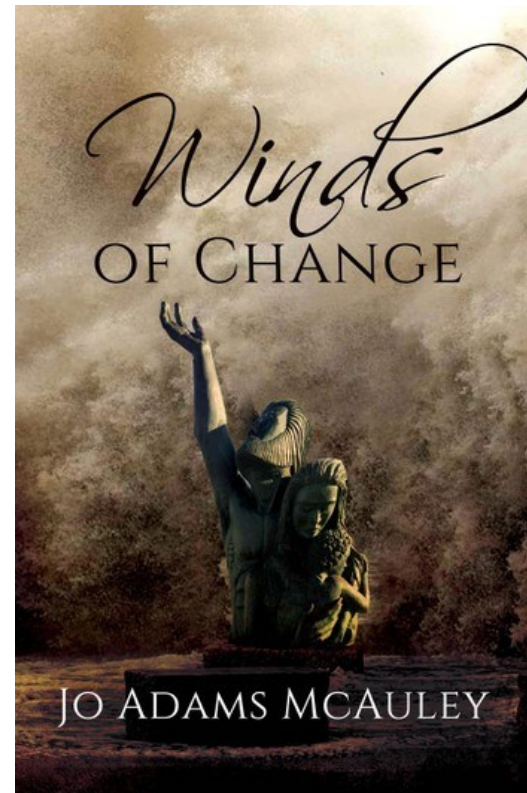
